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NV Villa Conchi Brut Cava

Penedès [ESP]

Fruit for this Cava is harvested from the hills surrounding Barcelona, protected by the mountain of Monserrat. It is aged for one year on its lees bringing great balance between texture and fresh fruit flavours. This wine would be the perfect aperitif at the start of any meal.

2015 Josef & Philippe Bründlmayer 'Lössterrassen' Grüner Velt.

Kremstal [AUST]

Vibrant, fresh and exciting! J & P Bründlmayer are organic producers in the Kremstal region of Austria that specialise in Grüner Veltiner. This wine has crisp and refreshing apple and citrus, with a slight herbal finish.

2016 Amble Sauvignon Blanc

Yarra Valley [VIC]

Amble Sauvignon Blanc is oh so hot right now! Made with skin-contact and minimal sulphur, it's a zippy and zesty wine with soft citrus notes and a hint of tropical fruit, before a little ginger spice rounds out the experience. Dom Valentine has created a delicious wine that shows off the versatility of the Sauvignon Blanc grape.

2014 Saint Claire Estate Chardonnay

Marlborough [NZ]

In a case of "everything old is new again", this Chardonnay from Marlborough heads back to the "classic" new world chardonnays of old. It has a rich creaminess with ripe stone fruit and spices. Drink it with roast chicken or baked fish.

2015 Quealy "Turbul" Friulano

Mornington [VIC]

Quealy have taken inspiration from the skin-contact and low-intervention wines of Friuli to become one of Australia's pioneer orange wine producers. This Friulano sees a couple of weeks on skins before it is put into barrel then left until bottling. The wine has deep yellow fruit and a savoury finish driven by gentle phenolic crunch.

2013 Manawa Pinot Noir

Marlborough [NZ]

Grape varieties other than Sauvignon Blanc often get overlooked when we think of Marlborough in New Zealand. One of the region's unsung heroes is Pinot Noir, a grape that enjoys warm days and long cool nights. The result here is delicate Pinot Noir with purity of fruit and a hint of smoky spice on the finish.

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2015 Champ des Murailles 'Nature' Corbières South West [FRA]

A low-intervention and zero-sulphur wine from an historic producer in the south of France. This wine is a perfect match for all of the rustic winter foods that we love. Think home-cooked stew, hard cheese and, of course, steak.

2015 Shady Lane Shiraz Grampians [VIC]

A quietly achieving champion of the classic Grampians Shiraz style - blackberry and blueberry fruits with a healthy dose of pepper and savoury spice. With fruit from the Hyde Park vineyard in Great Western and spending 12 months in old French oak, this comforting red will pull your socks up instead of blowing them off.

2015 Idolo Sangiovese Rubicone [ITA]

The Rubicone IGT in Emilia-Romagna in central Italy is a relatively new region known for making beautiful single-varietal wines such as this. This Sangiovese is a fruit-driven, easy drinking wine with some dried spice and silky yet present tannins.

2012 Vinarija Dingac Plavac Dalmatian Coast [CRO]

Wine has been made on the Dalmatian Coast since before the rise of the Roman empire. With this history of viticulture the red wine that rises to the top in Croatia is made from the grape Plavac Mali, a descendant of America's famous Zinfandel. This wine is robust, rustic and as rich in history as it is in flavour.

2014 Woodstock Shiraz McLaren Vale [SA]

The name behind Woodstock is Ben Glaetzer - a man who grew up in a family of winemakers and has been described by Campbell Mattinson as the 'prodigal son of Australian Shiraz'. Originally refining his craft in the Barossa, here he has set his sights on McLaren Vale creating a robust wine that typifies the region - a Shiraz that is deep in colour, beautifully oaked and generously rich on the palate.

2016 De Iuliis Late Picked Semillon Hunter Valley [NSW]

Self-described 'hardest name to say in the Australian wine industry', the De Iulliis [de-ooli-iss] family have made a wine that is sweet from lusciously ripe fruit and yet it is not cloying. It is silky and full, with concentrated stone fruit and marmalade flavours that work perfectly for a citrus dessert.
